

# PAINÉ HEADS SAINTS INTO FIRST DIVISION

## Only a 6-0 disaster against City can stop them now

**SOUTHAMPTON**, who have too often finished just short of promotion, stepped anxiously, and then emotionally, into the First Division last night.

They did it with a goal from England winger Terry Paine to the urgent chants of an invading army of fans, and refusing to recognise that disaster could still destroy their dream.

They must lose by six clear goals against already-promoted Manchester City next Monday to taste the bitterness of failure.

### Biggest Gate

Saints' 15,000 fans in a gate of 19,839 — Orient's largest of the season — shrugged that off as only the faintest possibility when the final whistle went.

They swept over the walls on to the pitch, engulfing their heroes and lifting them up on the human chariot towards the dressing-rooms.

With the police powerless to prevent them hailing their heroes, the ground belonged to Southampton.

The crowd stood in front of the stand, cheering and chanting, and were silent only when manager Ted Bates came out to answer them.

But it had been a night of anxiety, of frustration, so very nearly of failure.

Southampton began as though outright victory was necessary to their ambition.

They seemed to forget that just one point could give them the assurance of promotion.

They swept into attacking football, left themselves without cover, and came close to paying the price.

Orient, already doomed to the Third Division, produced perhaps their finest half-hour of the season. They were a goal up in eleven minutes through Peter Allen.

Ironically, the Saints, who have put their faith in entertaining football, were forced to step down into a primitive style.

### Hopeful

They pushed Martin Oliviers and Norman Dean up on to Orient's defence and plied them with long hard — and often hopeful — passes from the back.

In the fifty-second minute the tactics paid off.

Former Orient full back David Webb restored an anxious situation in Saints' penalty area. The ball went back to goalkeeper Campbell Forsyth, who thumped it high and hard at Orient's defenders.

It bounced once and was helped on by centre half Gordon Ferry trying to find safety.

And in went Paine to head perhaps the most valuable goal he has scored for Southampton.
