Sorry you've been troubled—Orient

ORIENT CHAIRMAN Arthur Page made an astonishing half-time announcement to the 6,000 crowd at Brisbane Road, apologising for the standard of play in the final Football League game of the season.

Page said over the loudspeakers: "I am sorry you have got to watch this match, which gives the impression of being a real end-of-the-season performance. We hope it will be better in the second half."

The players would, no doubt, consider his unusual comments as harsh.

As far as Orient were concerned the second half was a vast improvement. After losing early scoring chances, they fell a goal behind when Tinnion neatly converted a low cross by Hale.

Soon after the interval, Allen moved into the target area to equalise with a well-controlled half-volley.

And 10 minutes later, Went won a tackle with Kirkman in midfield, squared the ball to Smith, and then finished off the move running 25 yards to head in the cross for the winner.

Cliff Britton, Hull manager, who went to watch Went, must have been very impressed with this goal.

But whether Went is more effective in defence than in the loose role remains debatable—despite his mobility in scoring the winner.

Off form

Orient veteran Holton, needing only three goals to reach 300 in League football, was out of touch, although he did make Rogan pull off two good saves.

Goddard, Orient's young reserve goalkeeper—a bargain signing from Fulham—played intelligently, handled the ball well, and showed courage in diving at the feet of Tinnion and Middlemas.

This victory moved Orient up three places in the Third Division table to finish the season in a respectable position after struggling.

There was no doubt that manager Dick Graham and chairman Page did a fine rescue job at Brisbane Road.
