ORIENT WERE the smarter, more workmanlike outfit. They were quicker on the ball and capitalised on Rochdale's errors.

Orient's first goal came after 18 minutes, following a glorious run by Peter Brabrook. His pass had the home defence backpedalling and Dennis Rife scored. Just 14 minutes later Peter Allen did the ball to John Dyson, who crashed a great goal from 25 yards.

Then, minutes after the interval Rochdale's poor covering and marking let in Mike Bullock, who converted a Dyson cross for Orient's third.

HALIFAX who conceded only 19 away goals in winning promotion last season, were robbed in this match by a superb goal after only six minutes—the first to beat keeper Alex Smith this season.

Bullock performed a spectacular scissor-kick to volley the ball into the net.

Orient, with Harper urging them on from midfield, put on the pressure for a while but faded before the interval and in the second half Halifax at least deserved to force a draw.

"I think the boys were a little too concerned about Monday's League Cup replay at Fulham," explained manager Jimmy Bloomfield.

Mancini, dominant in the air, was the mainstay of the Orient defence with full-back Rife overlapping effectively on the wing.

Brabrook proved a constant menace and Dyson ran well up front.

The chief Halifax danger was Hill, playing in midfield.

He forced Goddard to a string of fine saves, hit a post with a free-kick and had a shot blocked on the line.

## Bullock flyer boosts Orient

ORIENT are riding high in the Third Division today—but one man reluctant to concede victory to them on Saturday was HALIFAX boss Alan Ball.

In fact, after Orient had beaten his squad 1-0 he gave them a roasting and ordered them for extra Sunday training and declared:—

"We should have beaten Orient easily. We were tight enough at the back, but the ball was just not running for us up front."

Orient were indeed lucky to score against a close-marking defence which conceded only 19 away goals during their promotion triumph last season.



They scored with a spectacular overhead kick from Mickey Bullock after only six minutes—and for the rest of the match struggled to keep out swift Halifax raids.

Andy Burpin, the all-action Halifax full-back, sent in a spinning shot which Ray Goddard had difficulty holding. Then Freddie Hill and Lammy Robertson shot into the goalkeeper's arms, and moments later a free-kick from Hill hit a post.

In the second half, Orient skipper Terry Mancini blocked a Hill drive on the line, and with 20 minutes to go Dave Shawcross fired in a 30-yard drive which Goddard fingertipped over the bar.

Then the Orient forwards got goal shy. Bullock tried another scissor-kick. Allen went close and Mancini twice had headers picked out of the air.

Shawcross was unlucky not to snatch a Halifax equaliser, but in zeroing on goal lost his footing on the lush turf.

## HARPER KEEPS ORIENT MOVING

ORIENT, with tomorrow's League Cup replay against Fulham nagging on their minds, went ahead after six minutes and then concentrated on keeping out the enthusiastic Halifax attack.

# CONWAY STUNS ORIENT

★ **FULHAM** scored their first goals of the season last night to claim the prize of a money-making second round League Cup tie against Leeds United.

The three goals that sank plucky Orient in this sparkling first-round replay can be valued at £3,000 each.

Fulham can expect to collect around £9,000 from their September 3 confrontation with the League champions.

Leeds manager Don Revie called in at Craven Cottage last night for a personal assessment of the challenge facing his team.

He left during the second half but saw enough to impress him that Fulham will be no Southern push-overs.

Their hard running and determination gave them a slight edge over Orient but the two-goal difference at the finish was a little flattering.

Fulham took the lead in the 25th minute with a messy goal that will be remembered only because it was the first they have scored and the first Orient have conceded this season.

Ray Goddard, former Fulham goalkeeper, and centre-half Terry Mancini failed between them to do what seemed the simple job of clearing a Stan Brown cross.

## Equaliser

The ball ran loose to Steve Earle, who had only to run it into the net.

Orient got a 63rd-minute equaliser when Peter Brabrook slammed a Malcolm Slater corner kick against goalkeeper Ian Seymour and Dave Harper followed up to hammer the ball into the net from 10 yards.

Johnny Haynes, producing occasional touches of his vintage form, limped out of the game six minutes later with a muscle injury, and Barry Lloyd substituted.

A Lloyd free kick, after he had been obstructed by Tommy Taylor, set up goal No. 2 for Jimmy Conway in the 73rd minute.

And Fulham snatched what appeared to be a fortunate third goal in the 86th minute. Taylor was adjudged to have fouled Les Barrett in the penalty area and referee Tony Oliver (Southend) awarded a spot kick after receiving instructions from a flag-waving linesman.

Conway coolly shot the penalty kick into the net.
